I chose to write sonnets for each season because I like writing poetry that rhymes. I also think that sonnets are fun to read and I thought sonnets would work well with my topic. I chose the font that I did because I believe it fit my anthology the best. I chose the titles of my haikus "The Birth of Spring" and "Nearing the End" because I think they describe the poems very well and get straight to the point. I chose the different titles of my sonnets by picking one adjective from each poem and using it to describe that specific season. I chose to do this because I thought it describes the poems well without totally giving the whole poem away. I decided to put my poems in order from chronological order starting with spring. I wanted to start with spring because that's when everything is sort of "reborn". On the other hand, I wanted to end with winter because that is when everything sort of dies and it relates more to the end than the beginning. I put a haiku at the beginning and end of my anthology to help lead the reader into my poems and also help end my anthology. When I first started writing my anthology I was going to writing a haiku about each season and write longer connecting poems but after I wrote the haikus I decided that I wanted to do longer poems about each season because I just couldn't fit very much information into a haiku. I wrote a stem poem and thought about adding the haikus into the stem poem but it didn't seem to flow very well so I decided to rewrite all of my poems and use sonnets and haikus and I think it worked out a lot better. I considered adding pictures to my poems but I decided that I wanted to let my poetry paint a picture in the mind of the reader and I thought that adding pictures would take away from that. I really tried to focus on being descriptive and use colorful words while I was writing my poems. I also made sure that every poem stayed true to my topic of nature.

Author's Notes

I wrote "The Birth of Spring" because I think that it is a good introduction to the rest of my anthology. I believe that it helps ease the reader into my next poem. I chose to write a haiku because haikus generally deal with nature and I wanted to keep the focus of my anthology on the beauty in each season of nature so I decided to make this poem shorter.



I wrote "Beautiful Autumn" because I wanted to express all of the little details that I remember about fall. I again tried to incorporate different sensory details throughout the poem. Toward the end of this poem I transitioned the details about nature in the fall toward winter in order to help make my anthology flow better. I chose to write a sonnet because I wanted the focus of the anthology to be on the nature throughout each season so I thought it would make more sense for the poems about the seasons to be longer so that they could have more details.

I wrote "Sparkling Winter" because I wanted to convey all of the little details about winter that many times people don't notice or take for granted. Winter is probably my favorite season and that made this poem a little more fun to write. I chose to write a sonnet because they are pretty long and that allowed me to describe the details of winter pretty well.
